Diploma of early Childhood Education and Care

This qualification reflects the role of educators in early childhood education and care who work in regulated children's education and care services in Australia. Educators at this level are responsible for designing and implementing curriculum that meets the requirements of an approved learning framework and for maintaining compliance in other areas of service operations. They use specialised knowledge and analyse and apply theoretical concepts to diverse work situations. They may have responsibility for supervision of volunteers or other educators.

Early childhood educators work in long day care Centre's, family day care, pre-schools or kindergartens.

Career Boost Program (Government Funding)

The Program delivers training designed to help individuals develop the higher-level skills necessary to secure employment, advance their careers, or progress to further education and training through related university or tertiary qualifications.

Eligibility Requirement

- 15 years of age or over and no longer at school
- A Queensland permanent resident
- An Australian or New Zealand citizen, Australian permanent resident (includes humanitarian entrant), temporary resident with the necessary visa and work permits on the pathway to permanent residency
- Not hold or be already undertaking a Certificate IV or higher-level qualification
- (Certificate III qualifications completed whilst at school will not exclude you from accessing this funding)

Trainer - This course offering will be delivered by Academy of Training (RTO #91215), in some cases with the assistance of our pre-approved training partners.
